Did you know that rainforests are located all over the world?

Tropical rainforests cover only a tiny part of the Earth's surface (7%), but half (50%) of the world's animal, plant, and insect species live in tropical rainforests. Rainforests are shrinking quickly as people cut and burn them down for other uses.

CHAMELEON

THREATENED

HOME: Tropical rainforests;


Africa, Asia, and Madagascar

DANGER: Loss of rainforest,

pet trade

DID YOU KNOW: Chameleons' tongues move so fast that humans can't see them. The tongue may be longer than its body! It sticks to the prey and pulls it back into the chameleon's jaws to be crushed.

LOOK & LISTEN: Chameleons communicate by changing their skin color.



BIRD OF PARADISE

HOME: Tropical climates & local botanic gardens; Native to South America

DANGER: NOT Endangered.

DID YOU KNOW: This is a PLANT, not a bird! It's related to bananas and can grow to over 6 feet tall.

LOOK & LISTEN: Sunbirds perch on this flower to drink nectar. The birds get pollen on their feet, then spread it around the forest making more Birds of Paradise grow.



DID YOU KNOW? We need trees to live!

- Trees breathe out OXYGEN through their leaves.
- Humans need oxygen to breathe and stay alive.
- There are billions of trees in the rainforest, it's like a huge breathing machine!
- · Rainforests are often called the LUNGS OF THE PLANET!





Take a bath and make a plant happy!

- 1. Bring a lucky, leafy houseplant into a small bathroom.
- 2. Create a rainforest environment by turning on the shower's hot water and shutting the bathroom door.
 - 3. Collect the water in the tub while running the shower to take a bath with when you are done.
 - 4. Leave the shower on a few minutes until it gets steamy. Feel the moist, warm air. Does it feel different to breathe?
 - 5. Does your plant look happier?
